

## Base Ball.

### ATLANTIC VS. STAR.

The return game between these clubs took place on the Capitoline grounds on Saturday, Sept. 5, and, though the ground had been soaked the day previous with the great rain-storm, the field was in excellent order, and the weather very fine. The Atlantics had out an excellent nine, CRANE alone being an absentee, KENNY taking his place in the nine. SMITH playing in his old position, with FERGUSON behind, and MILLS in CRANE'S position. PEARCE playing third. In fact, the Atlantics went into the match as if for practice, some being without their uniforms. The Stars had out one of the best nine: they have presented this season—the right men being in the right place, apparently—DALLARD, their new second baseman, playing in the nine for the first time, and his *débüt* as a Star player was marked by an excellent display of fielding, he assisting in putting out six players, besides capturing eight others in his position.

The game was opened by the Atlantics, who led off with a score of four, the Stars being easily white-washed. In the next two innings, the Atlantics were limited to an addition of two runs to their score, but it was two more than the Stars could get. In the fourth inning, the Atlantics made a pretty double play by REEVES, DALLARD and CLYNE, marking the folding, the Stars being white-washed for the fourth time. In the fifth and sixth innings, the Stars banded the white-wash brush neatly, and waking at last to their batting, ran up a score of six, leaving the totals at the close of the sixth inning, at nine to six only—in favor of the Atlantics. This was close work, and a creditable result for the boys. In the next three innings, however, they were disposed of for a single, the Atlantics, in the interim, adding seven to their score, the tally at the close leaving the victory in the hands of the Atlantics by a score of sixteen to seven. The first game between them, which was one of the best displays of the season, resulted in the score of thirteen to two, only.
