ATLANTIC CLUB VS. MUTUAL CLUB.

The conquering game of the home and home match between these Clubs, took place yesterday on the St. George's cricket ground, Hoboken, the charge for admission being ten cents; and there were more persons present on the occasion than there have been during the entire season on the St. George's, New-York and Manhattan cricket grounds combined. This shows that cricket has been almost obliterated by base ball, which, but ten years since, was in its infancy and could only count a corporal's guard to witness a match, while a cricket match would be attended for a couple of days together by from 8,000 to 10,000 persons. The main cause of this is, that a few cricketers—who have become stale in the opinion of the public—play pretty much in all the matches for the few Clubs (except St. George) that exist only in name; while Base Ball Clubs play their matches with their *bona fide* members, and consequently their medium players always have a prospect before them of being chosen to play in either first-class or second-class matches with other Clubs, or in matches between the members of their own Clubs, provided they can acquire the least practical knowledge of the game. The base-ball match, yesterday, was hardly up to the mark, or equal to the great reputation of the two Clubs; a great deal of money changed hands on the result. It must be said, in mitigation, that the Mutuals were short of some of their regular first nine, and that the conformation of the ground was very much against the fielding. The match was not by any means as evenly played as was the great match on Monday between the first nines of the composers of the *NEW-YORK TIMES* and *Sunday Mercury*.
